This exhibition highlights the various and intergenerational activities practiced in Chinese public gardens.

In China, as early as six o'clock in the morning, some followers of taiji quan are the first to arrive and give their blessings to public gardens. Then, they are followed by friendly gymnasts, singers and choirs, dancers, classical musicians, ballplayers, skill games lovers, cards or mah-jong players. In October 2011, Michèle Koltz-Chedid and Aurélie Choiral photographed the activities of Chinese seniors in the parks of Beijing and Chengdu. To their great surprise, they realised that many active young people join the crowd of pensioners in this playful and joyful world.
